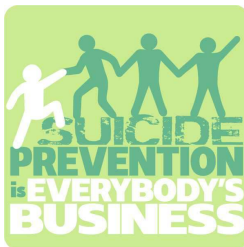

- About 1 out of 4 adults grew up in a household with alcohol dependence.
- A high incidence of ACEs (4+) increases the risk of both suicide attempt and injected drug use.
- Women are 50% more likely to have ACES of 5+.
- Early screening and resources for families is vital.

A few of [our local towns](#) have recently voted on, or will soon be voting on, ordinances for both retail and medical marijuana:



- **Lebanon** voted on May 9th to prohibit retail marijuana establishments.
- **Berwick** voted on May 9th to amend the land use ordinance regarding placement/operation of medical marijuana facilities.



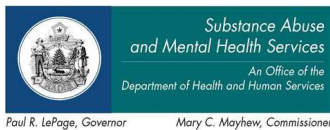

- **York** voted on May 20th to prohibit retail marijuana establishments.
- **Wells** will be voting June 13th on zoning/performance standards for medical marijuana facilities, and prohibiting retail marijuana establishments.

Parents Who Host Lose the Most

CTBH is working with community partners like the Kittery Schools to raise awareness about the risks of providing alcohol to minors.



Share the message!

- It is illegal to host or allow teen drinking parties in your home.
- Parents can be prosecuted under the law.
- If you break the law, you can face a sentence of up to one year in jail and up to a \$2,000 fine.
