State updates:

The state's moratorium on retail operations expired February 1st. [According to the Maine Municipal Association](#), there is "no prohibition on applying at the local level prior to state licensing. It is not clear how officials in the municipalities without moratorium or prohibition ordinances should handle any 'foot in the door' type requests."

What happens next?

The Maine Legislature and the Marijuana Legalization Committee continues to meet and work on draft regulations to be sent forward for the entire Legislative body to vote on. The Governor vetoed the Legislature's

Building Resilience Among Youth

Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES)



23% of Maine high school youth report at least 3 ACES - or incidents of trauma.

Trauma affects a child's development and puts them at much greater risk for future health problems like obesity, heart disease, smoking, drug use and poor mental health.

Both York and Kittery Schools have collaborated with Choose To Be Healthy to bring ACES and resilience building expert Sue Mackey Andrews to train nearly 200 staff and parents!
